

**VILLAGE OF CASTLETON – ON – HUDSON**  
**PUBLIC HEARING**

The purpose of this Public Hearing was to seek public comment on the street and parking signs in the Village.

Mayor Keegan called the Public Hearing to order. Trustee Carner reported that she and Foreman Saville had driven through the Village to check traffic signs. Some “dead end” signs have been replaced. There were some signs that are faded so they will be replaced. A resident mentioned that the one way sign was down on Stimpson Ave. and 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, Foreman Saville said it was on his list. It was also mentioned that there isn’t a stop sign on Brashear Place, but that is a Town street.

Donald McKnight inquired about the four way signs on Ransom Ave. and Green Ave., stating that they were originally put up because of the Castleton Kids Program that was located at the Lutheran church. He was questioning the stop signs on Green Avenue. Pamela Gleeson, who lives on Green Avenue, stated that she would prefer to keep the signs as they tend to slow people down.

Another concern was that Stewarts sometimes puts sandwich boards on the corner of South Main Street and Scott Avenue making it difficult to see when turning off of Scott Avenue onto Main Street north or south.

Parking on Seaman Avenue was also brought up as a problem. If someone parks on the street there is very little room to get by. There may be something in the Code Book about parking on this road.

Foreman Saville is going to check with the County and State to see if a NO THRU TRAFFIC sign can be put up. Seaman Avenue is being destroyed by the heavy traffic and large vehicles that use it as a short cut. Attorney Crist suggested lowering the tonnage weight limit for the road.

At 7:15 PM a motion to close the Public Hearing was made by Trustee Phibbs, seconded by Trustee Mannion and carried.
